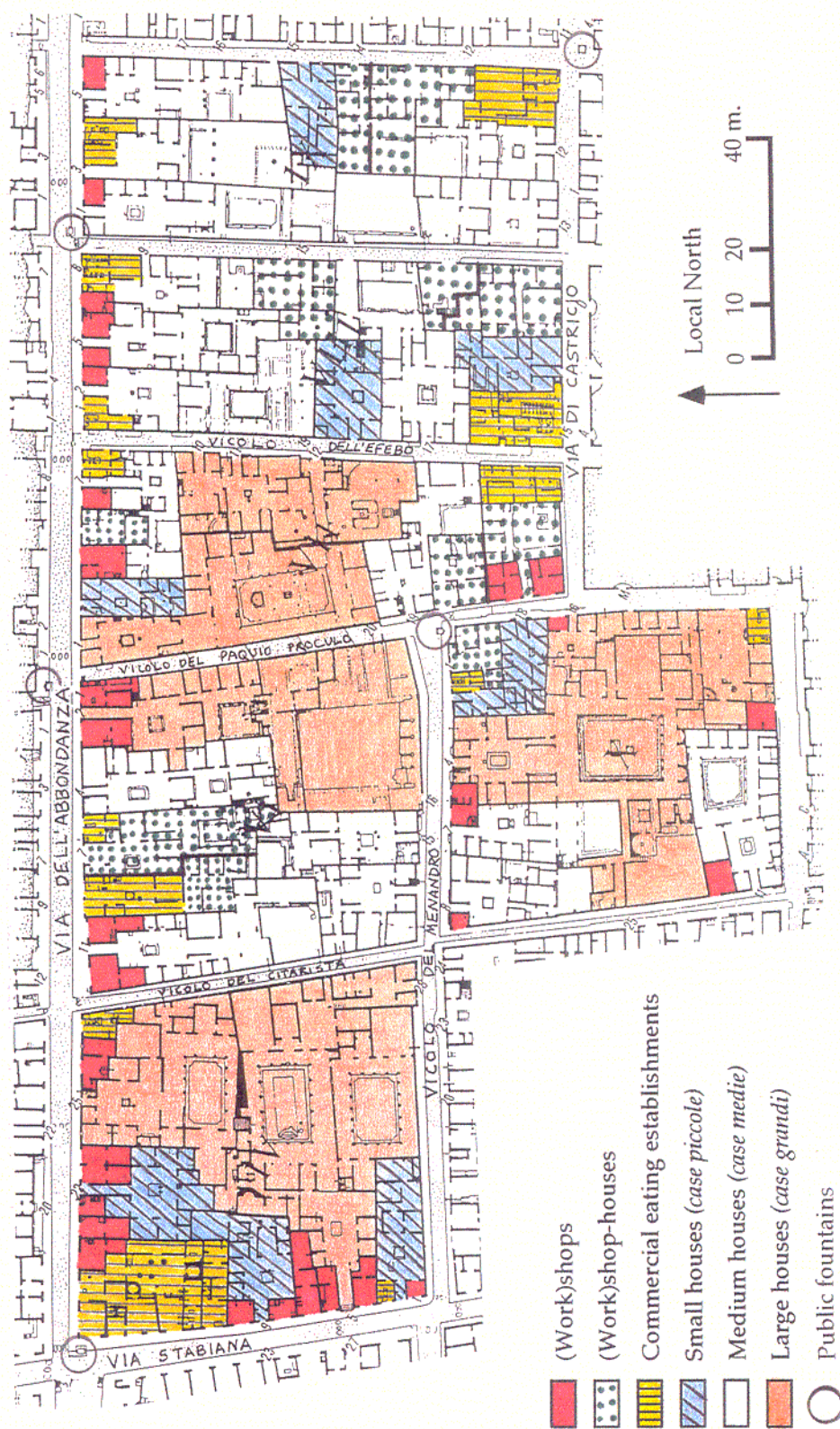


Fig. 2.1: Map of Pompeii: the buildings of the study samples and comparanda



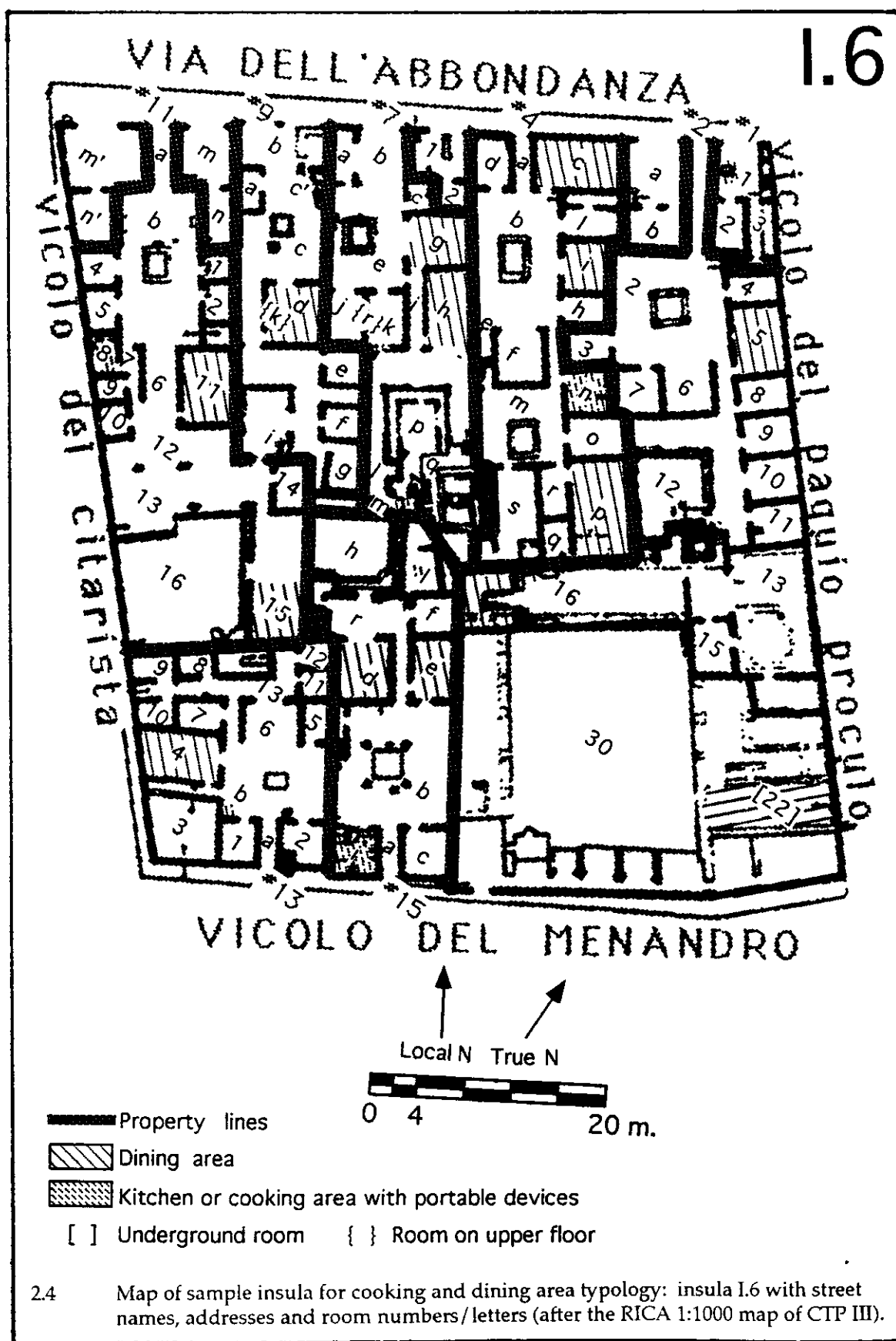
2.2 Map of the insulae and streets of the study sample at Pompeii, and the distribution of building types (after the RICA 1:1000 map of CTP III).

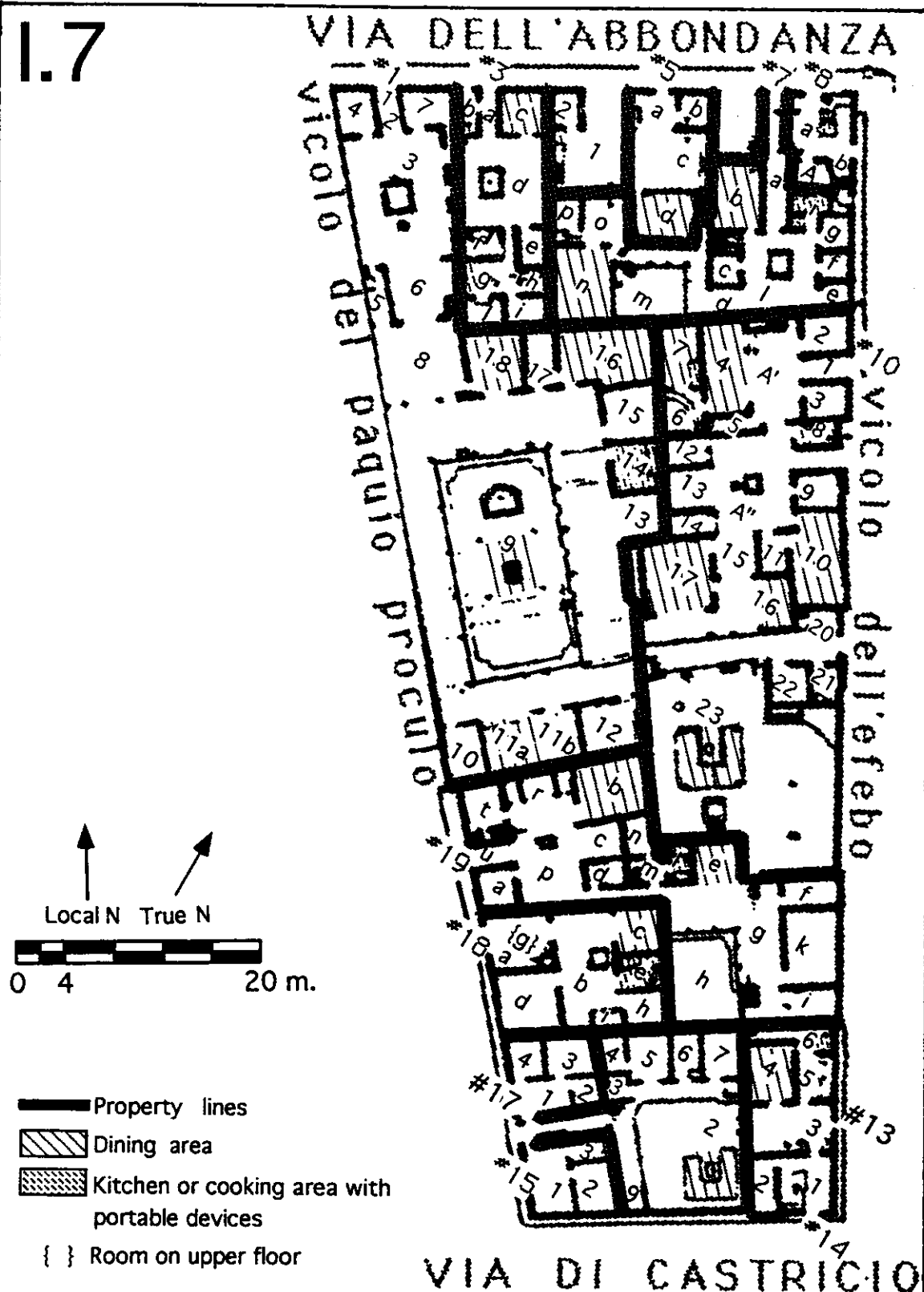

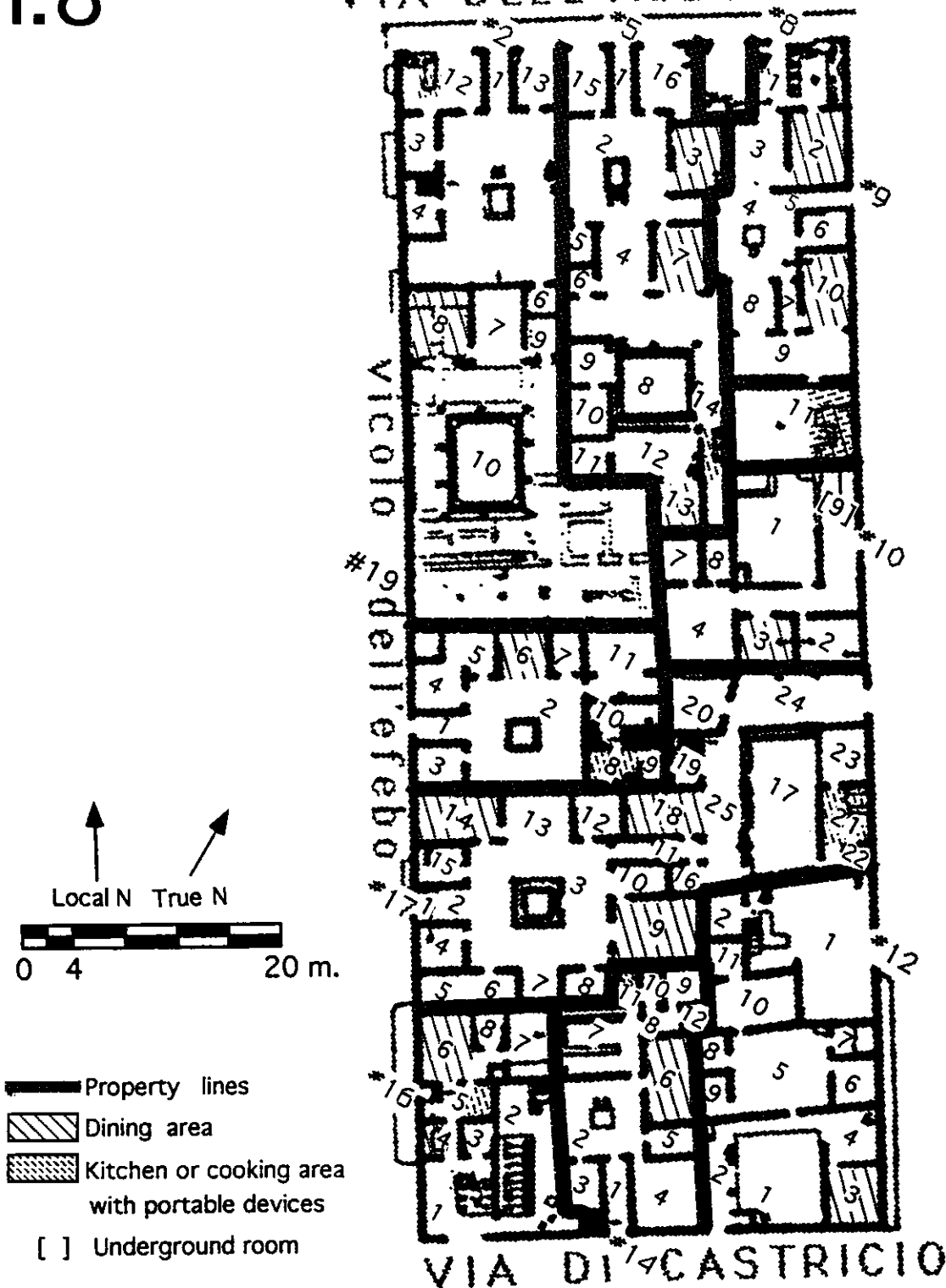

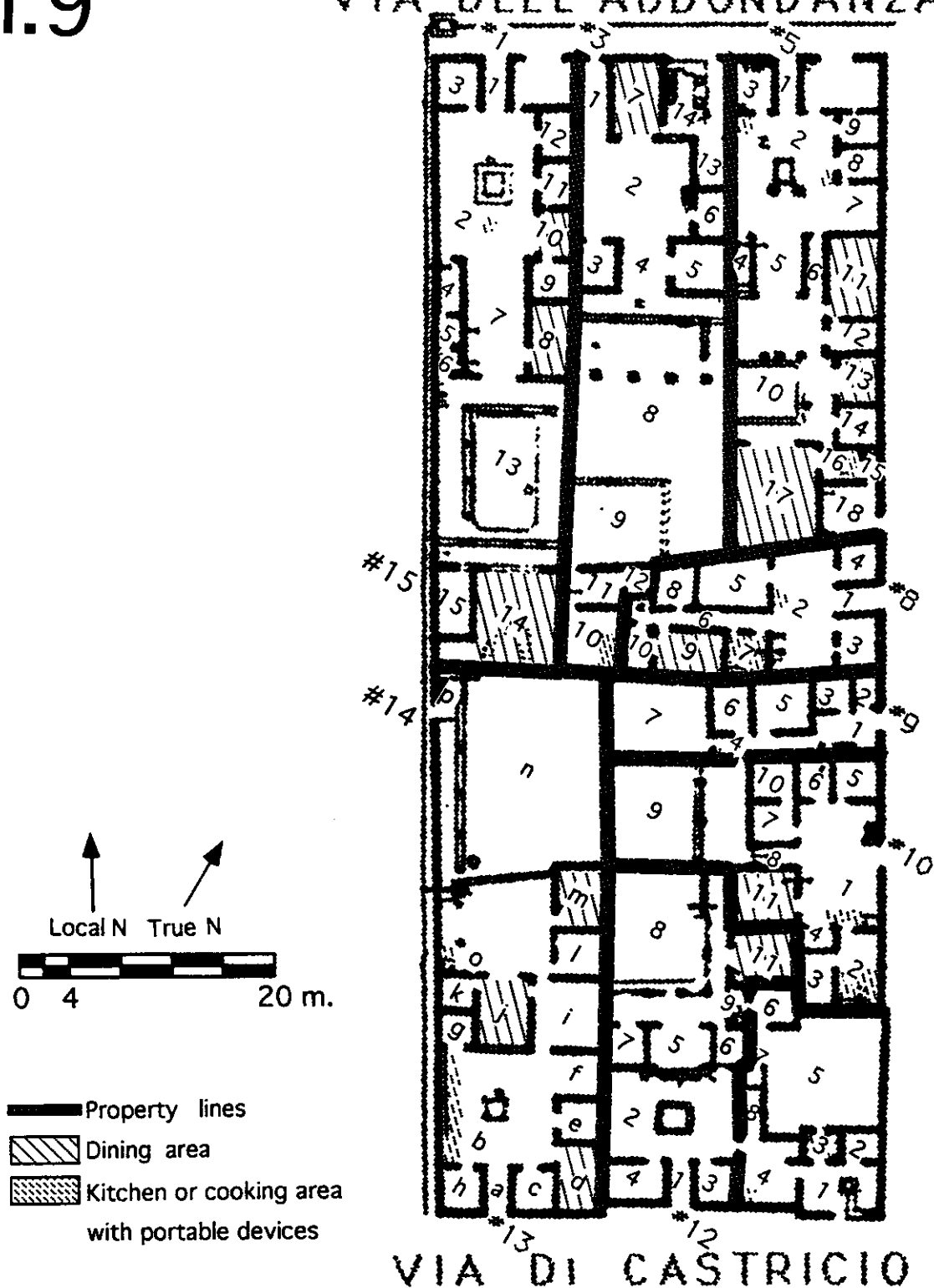

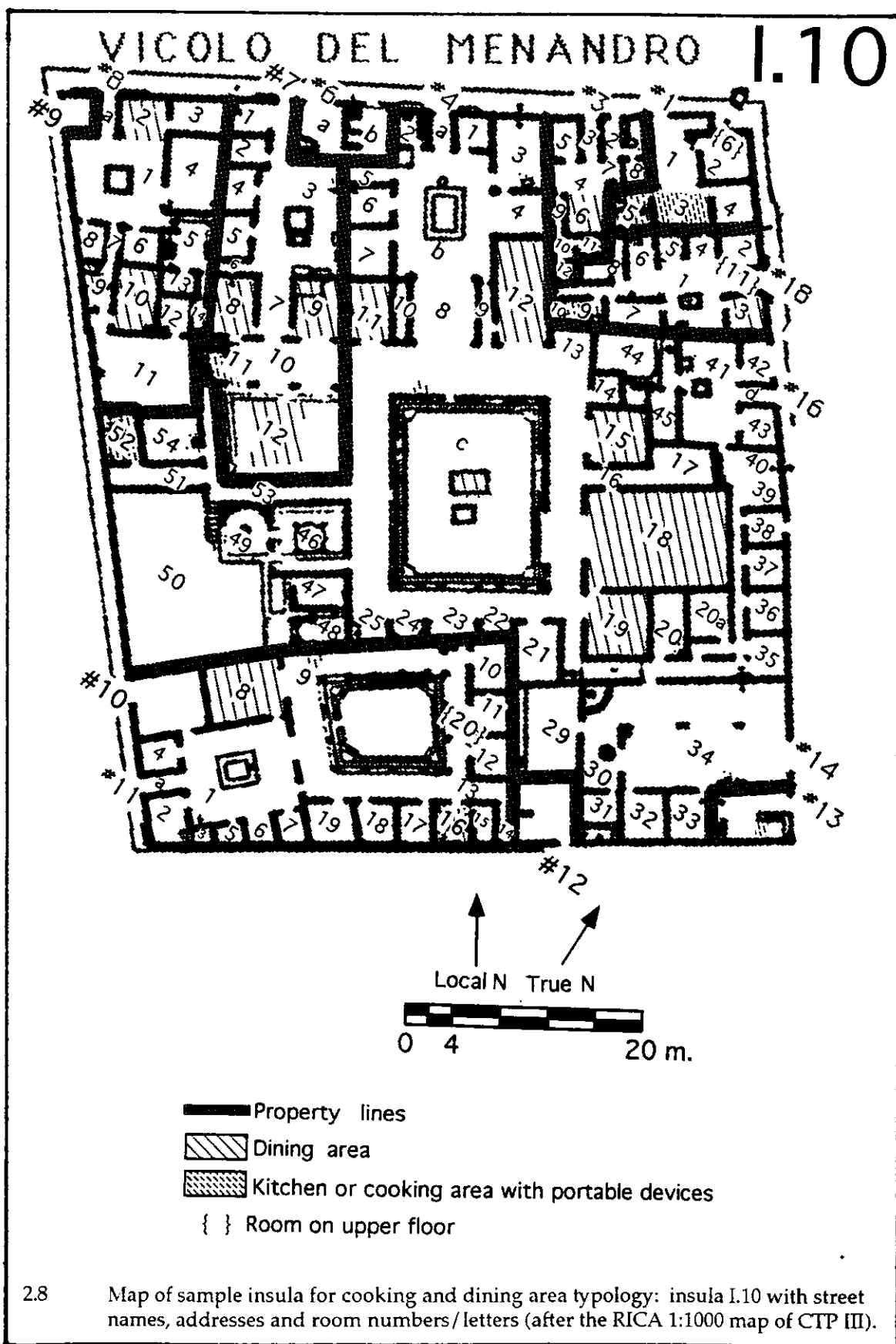

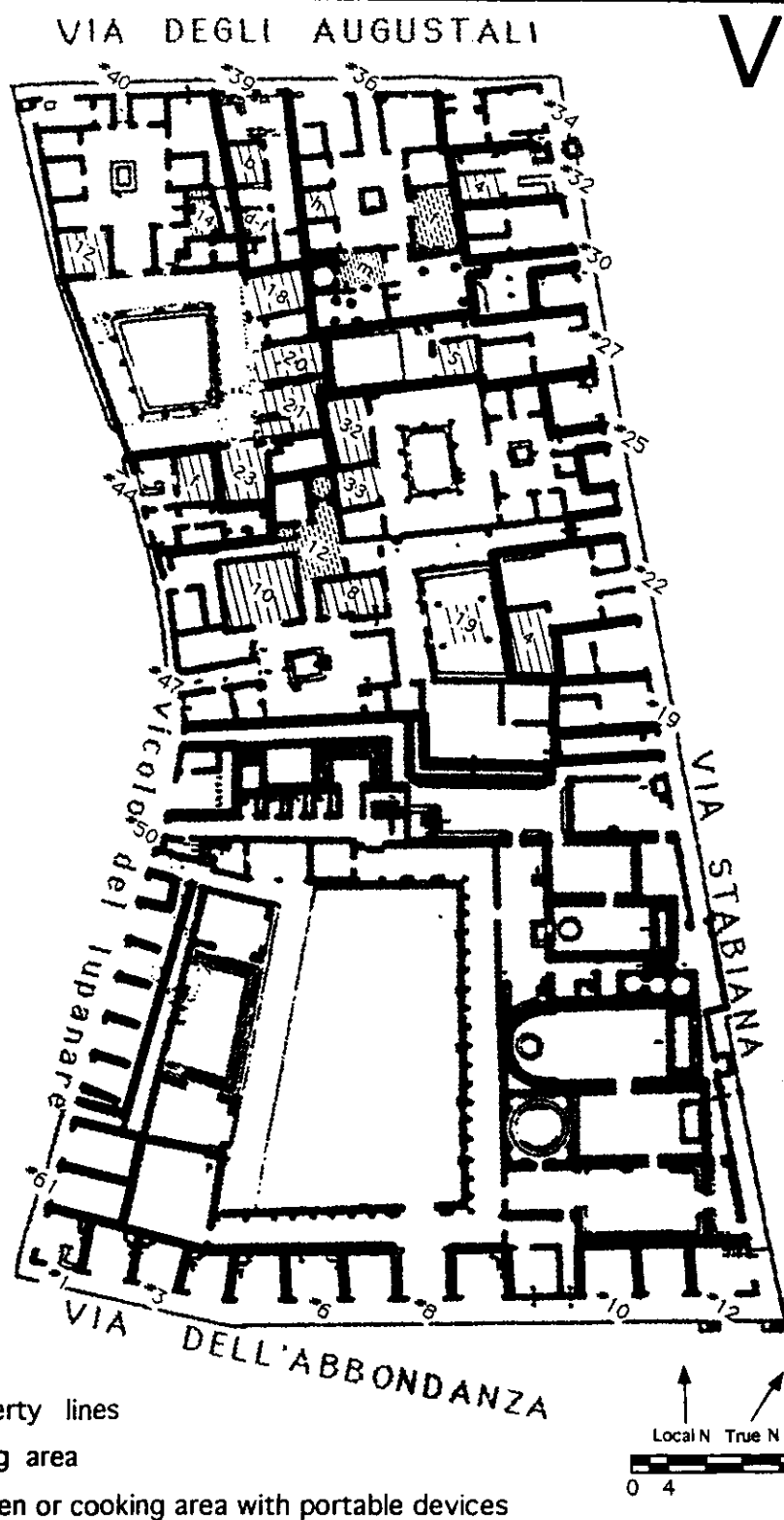
Map of sample insula for cooking and dining area typology: insula I.9 with street names, addresses and room numbers/letters (after the RICA 1:1000 map of CTP III).







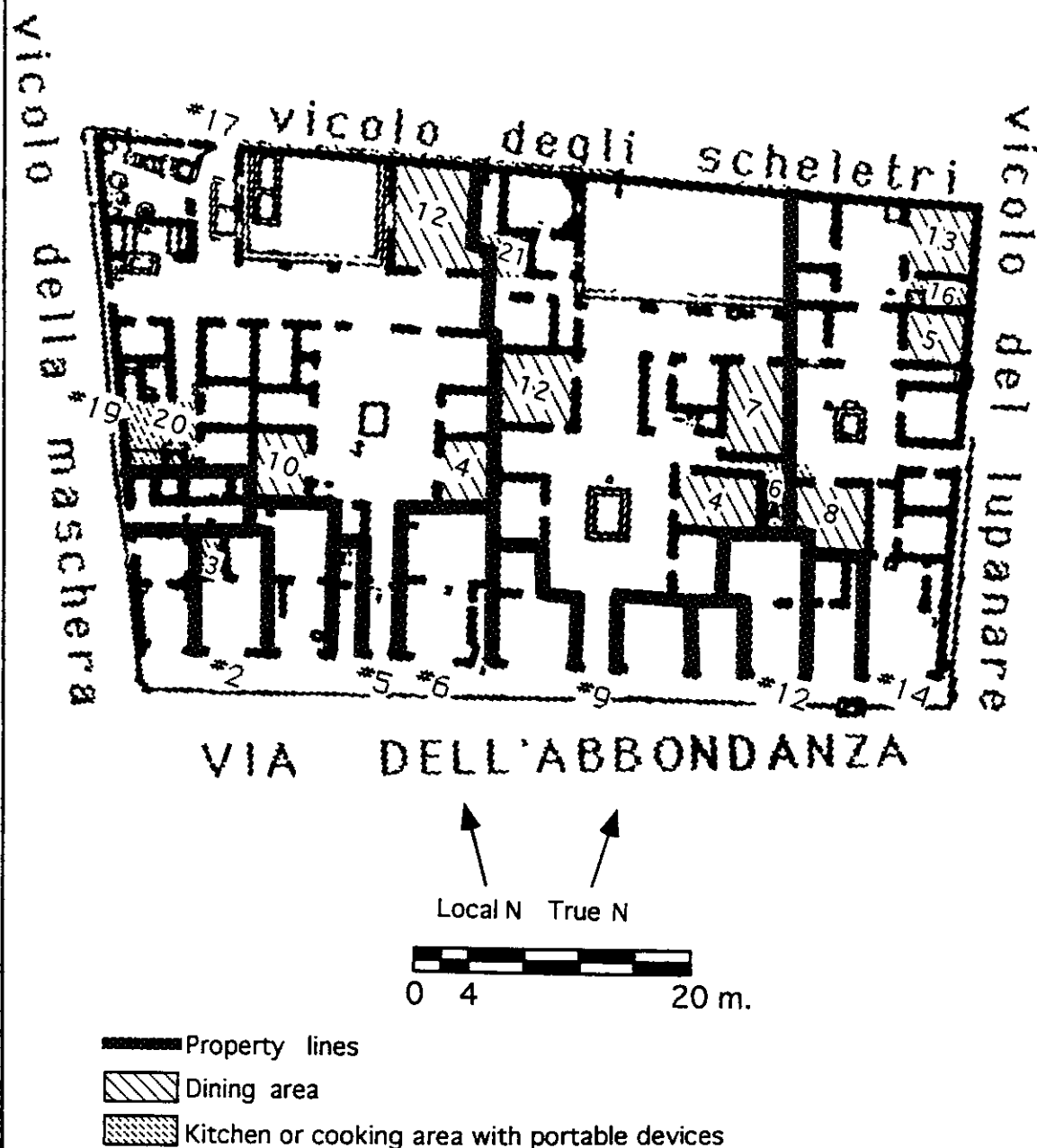

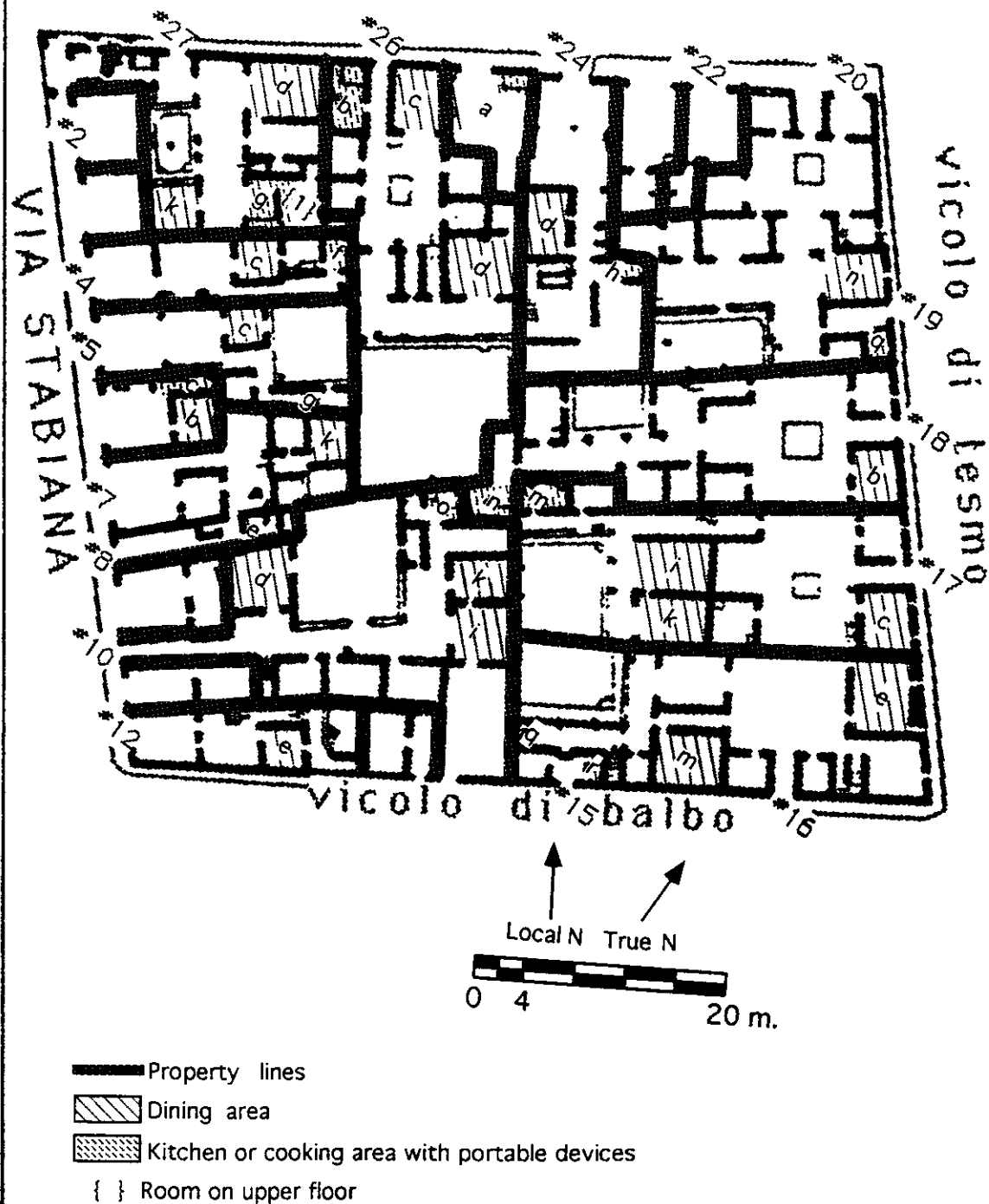
Map of sample insula for cooking and dining area typology: insula VII.14 with street names, addresses and room numbers/letters (after the RICA 1:1000 map of CTP III).

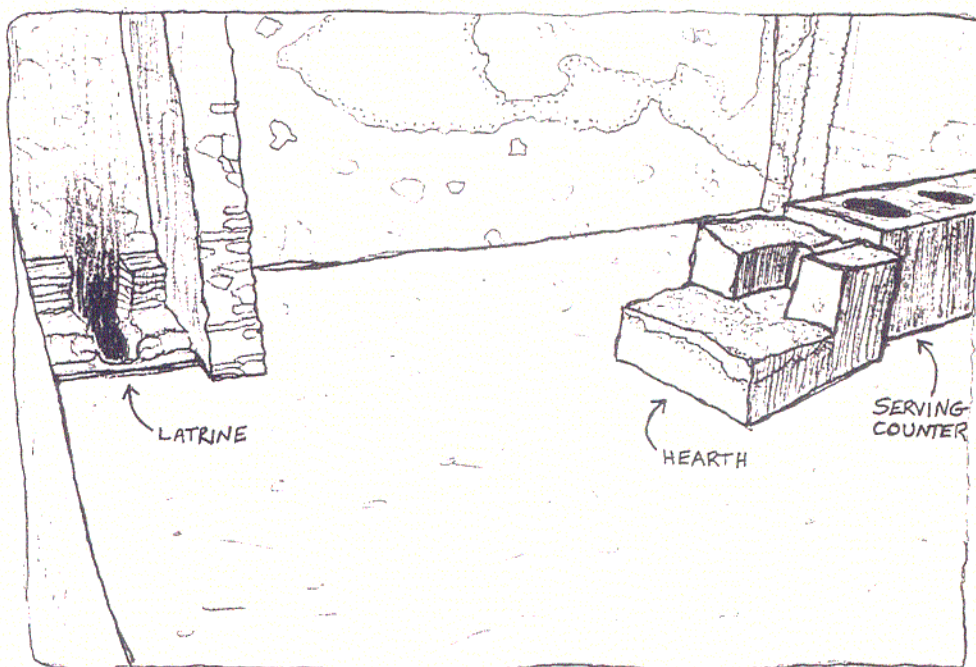

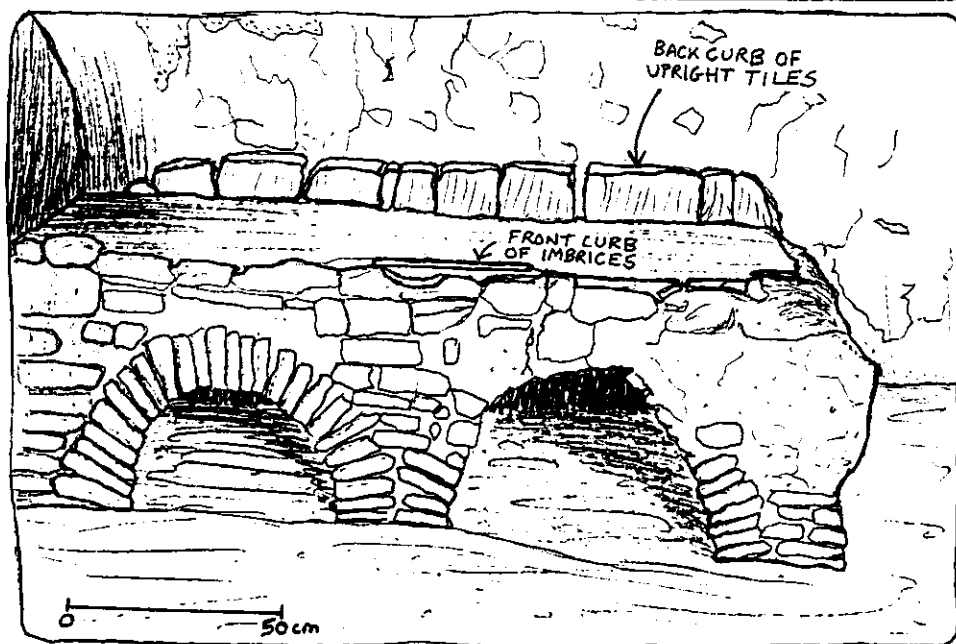




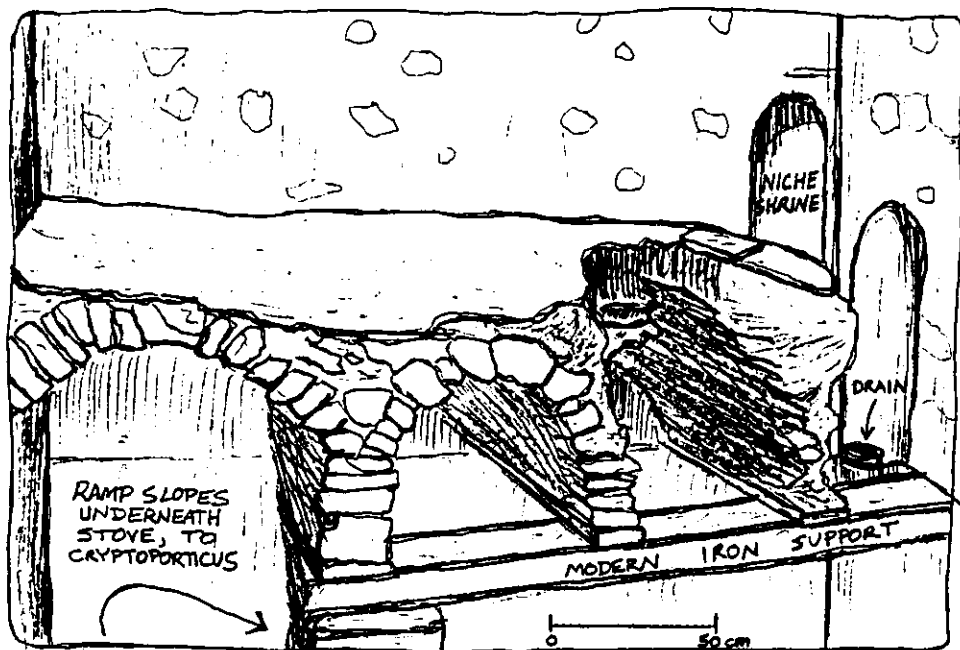

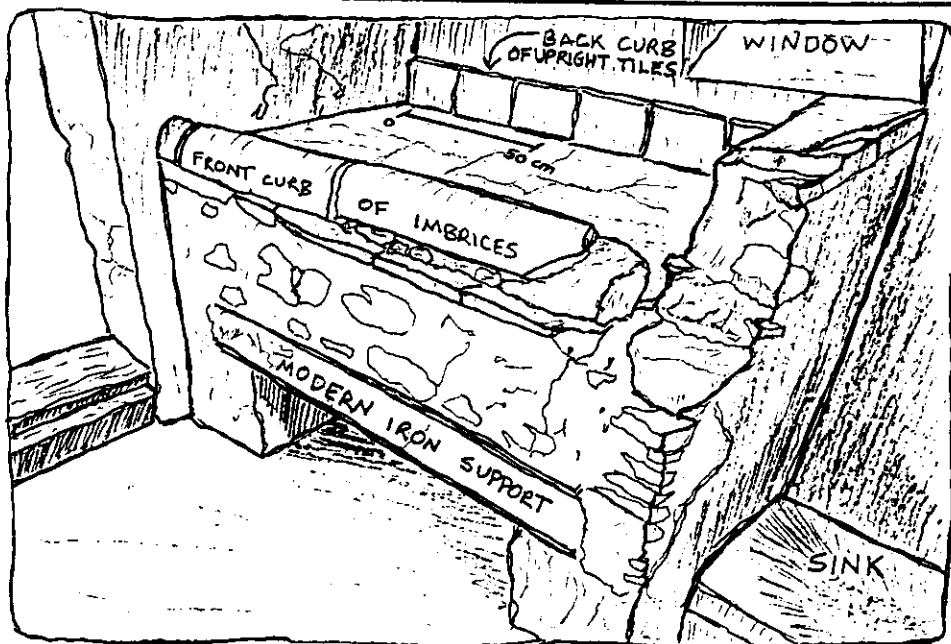

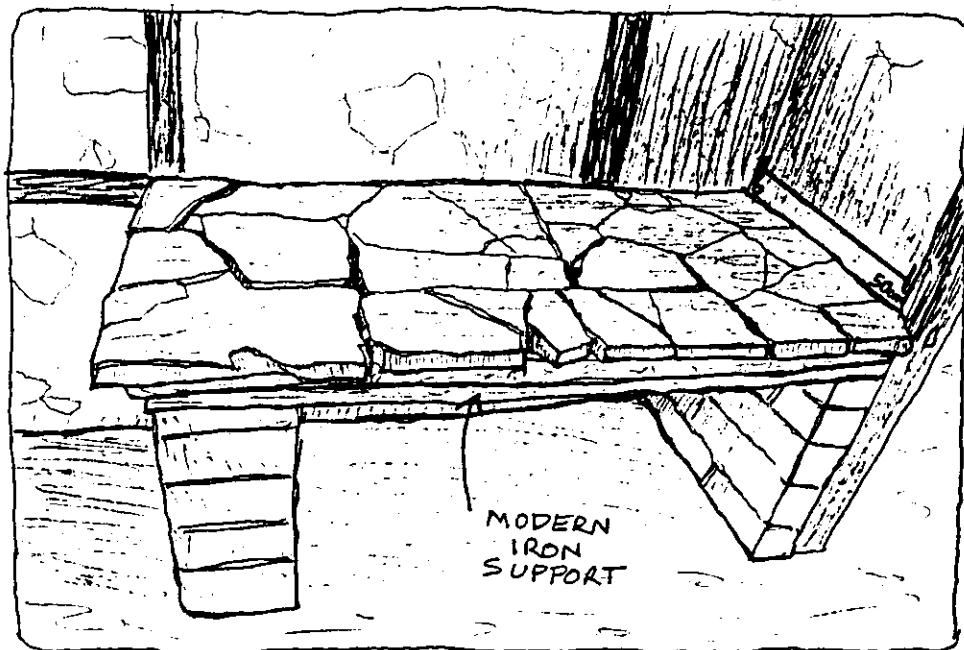

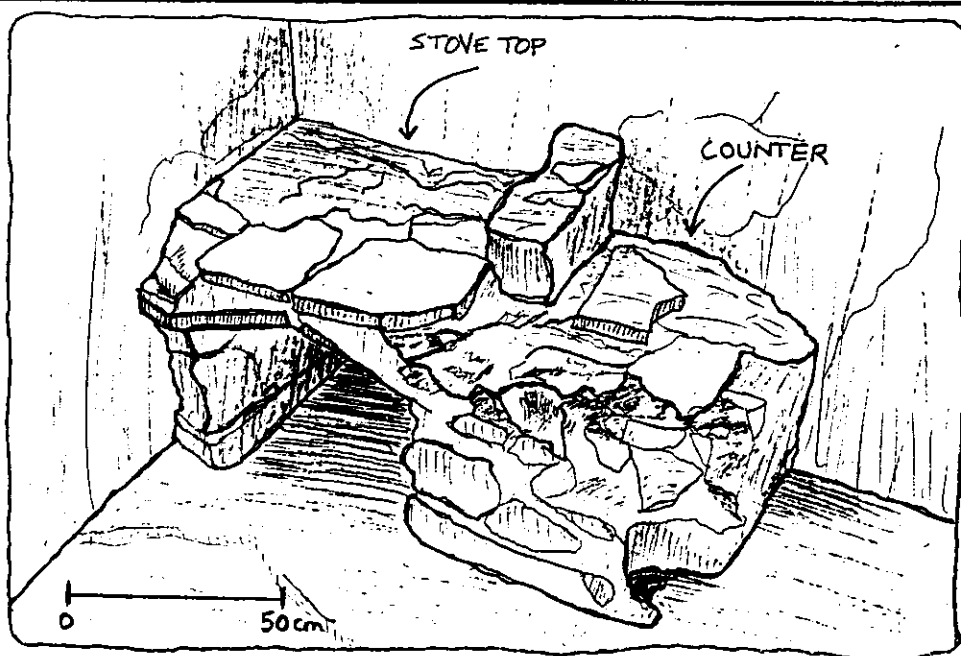

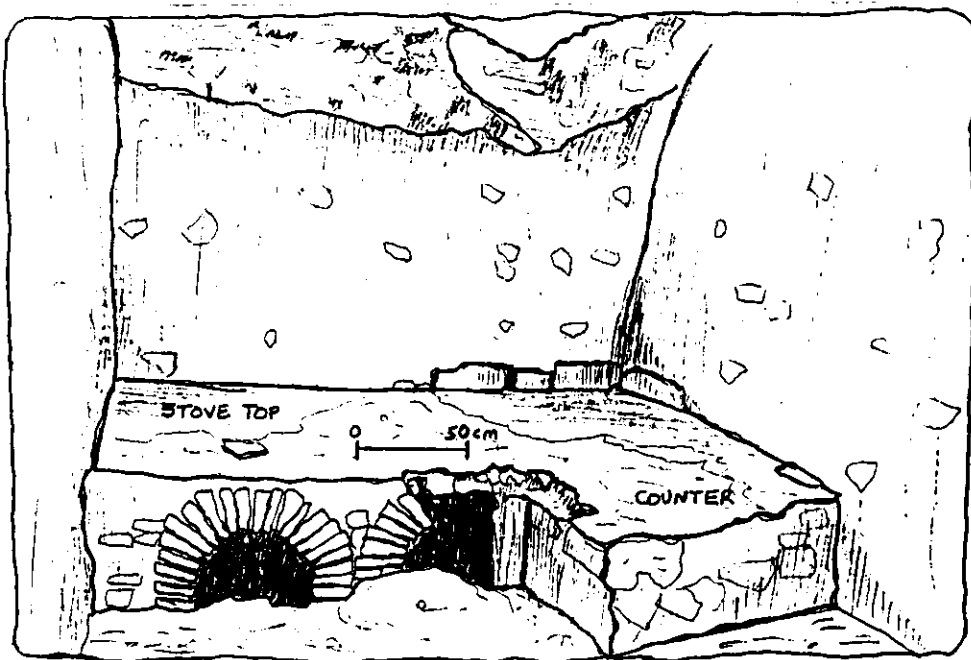

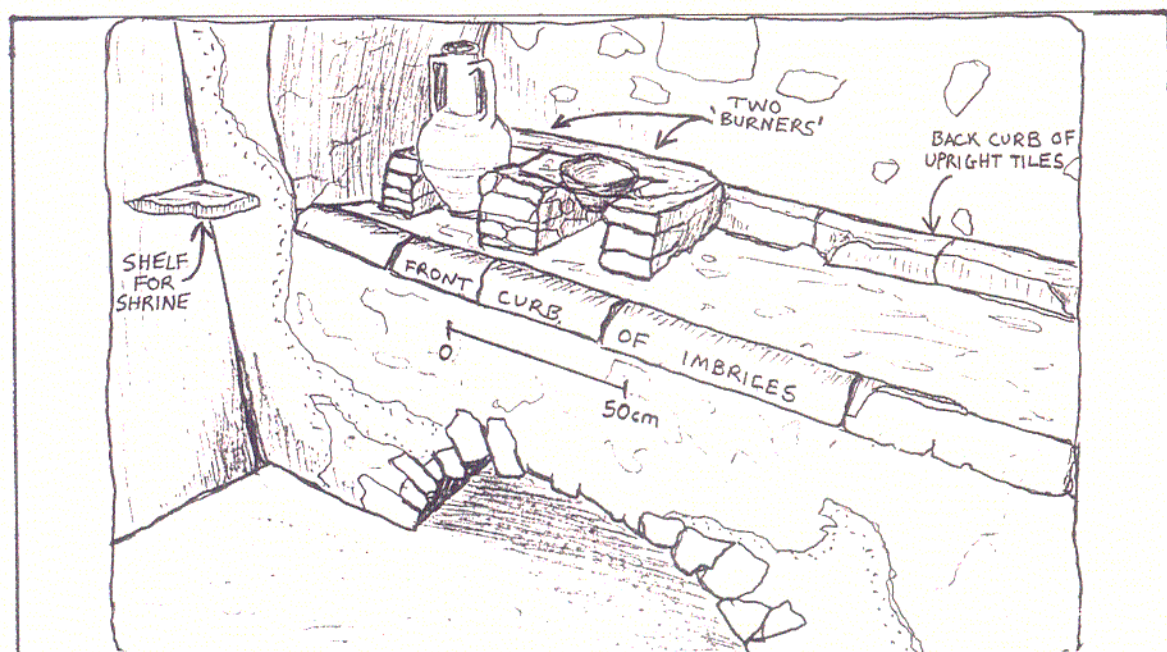

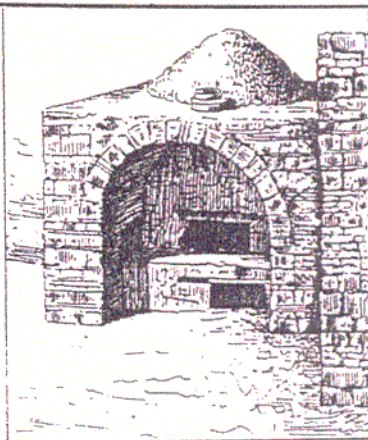

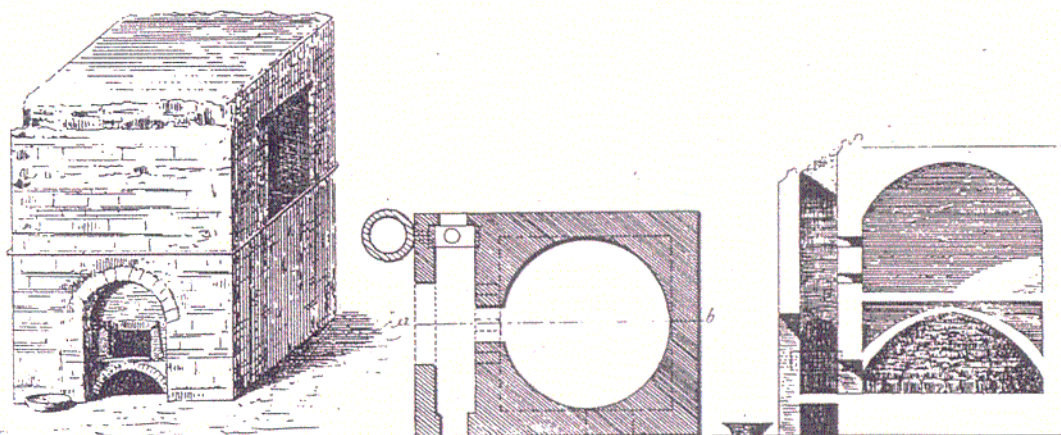

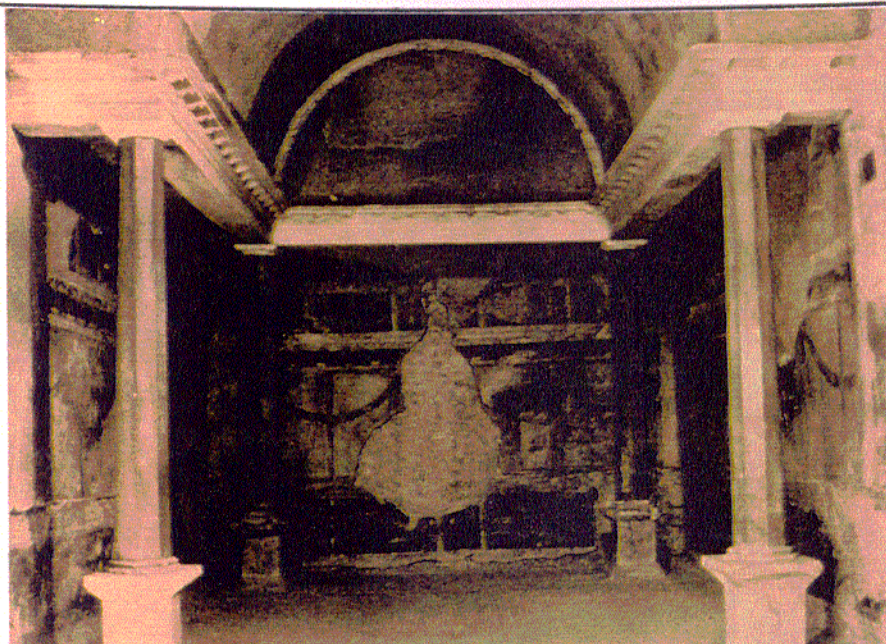

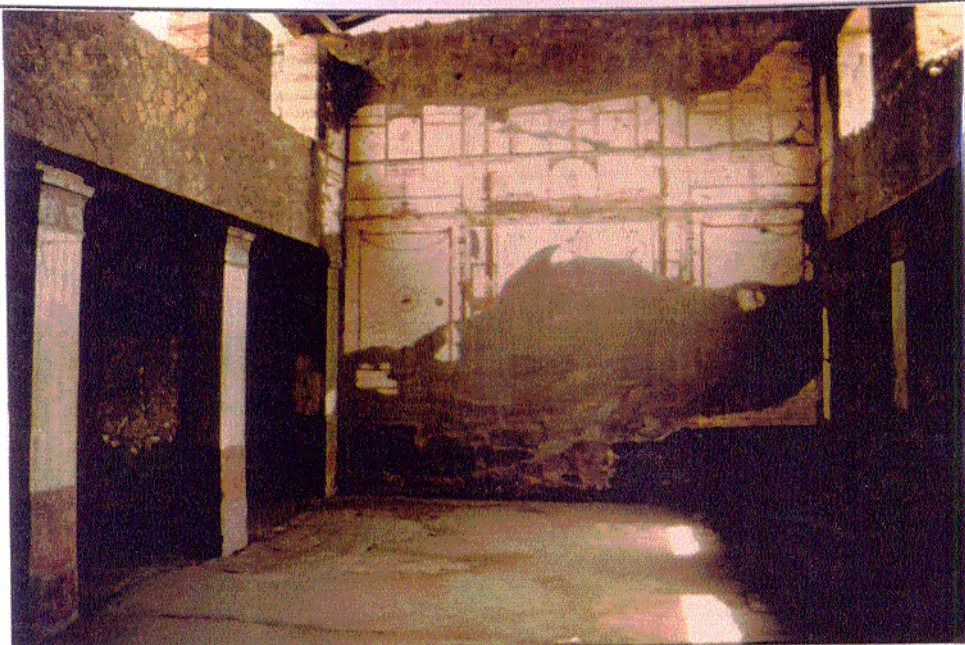

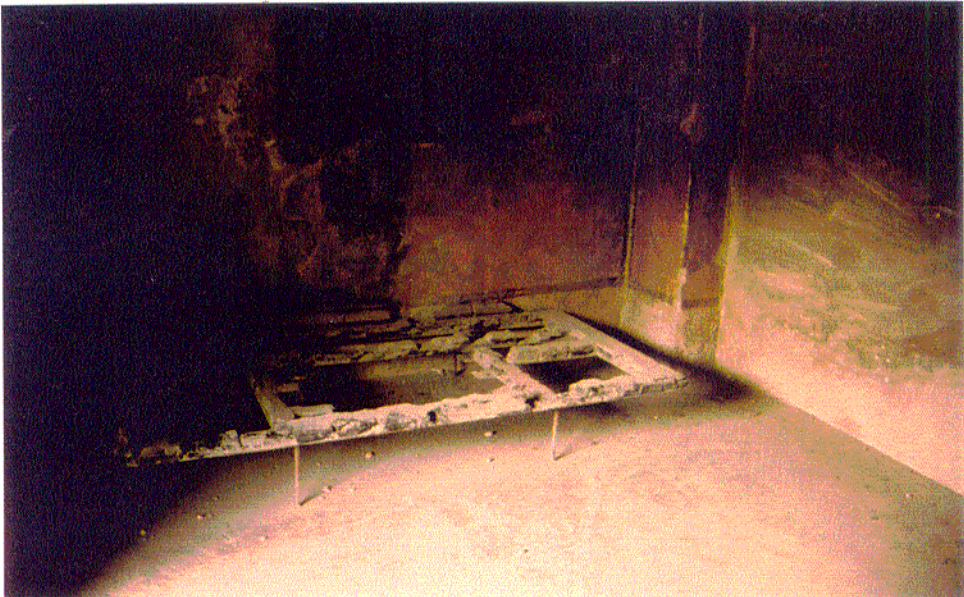

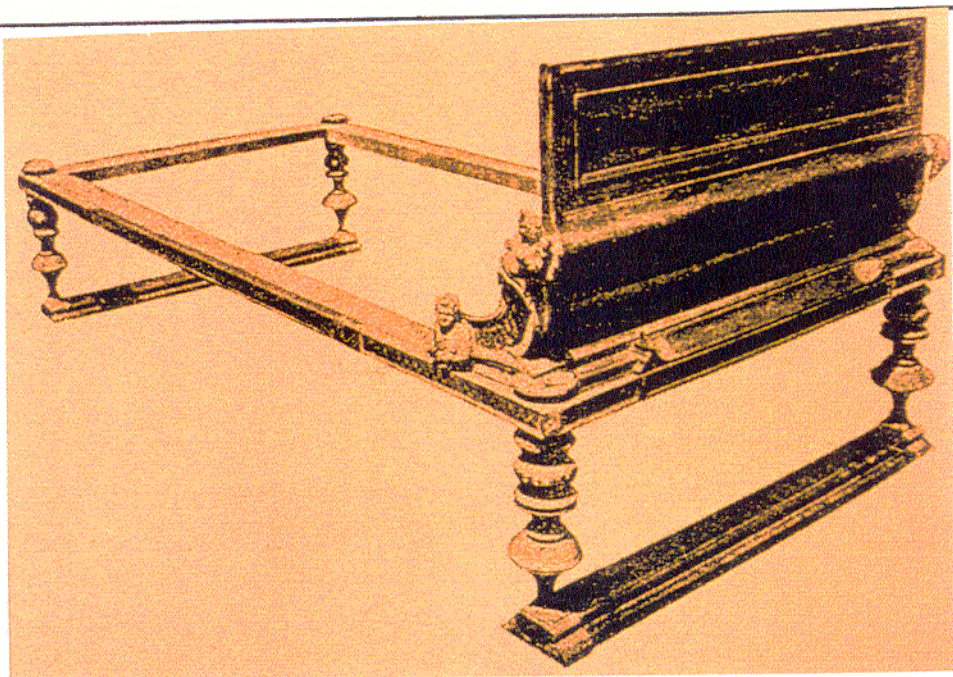

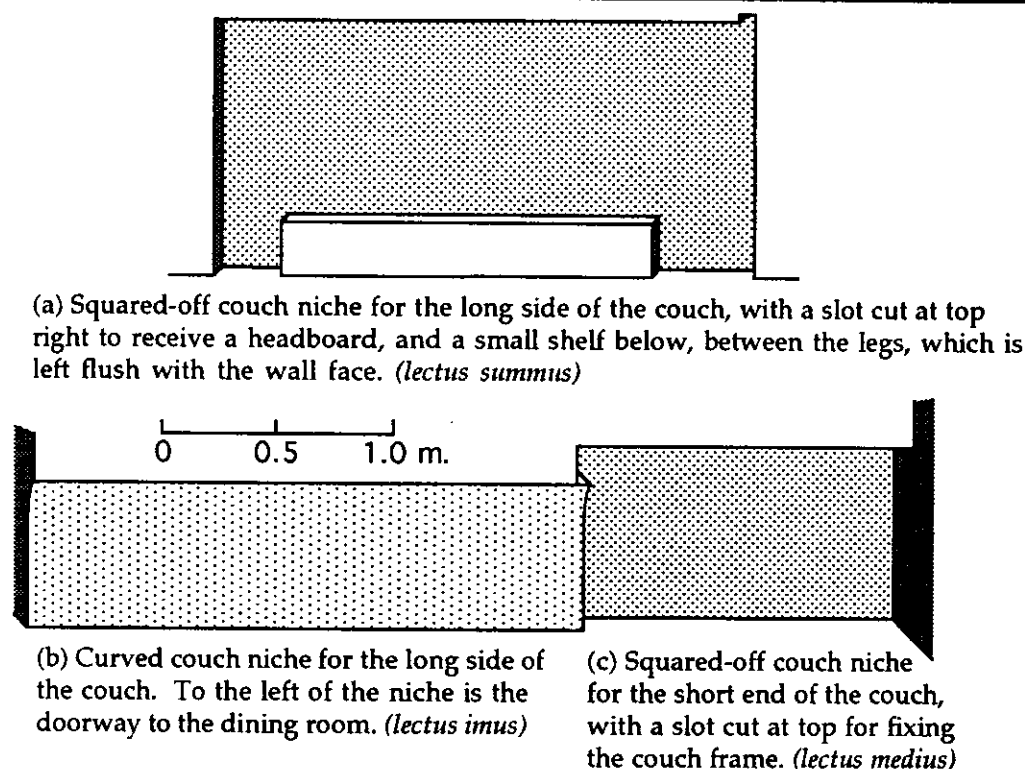
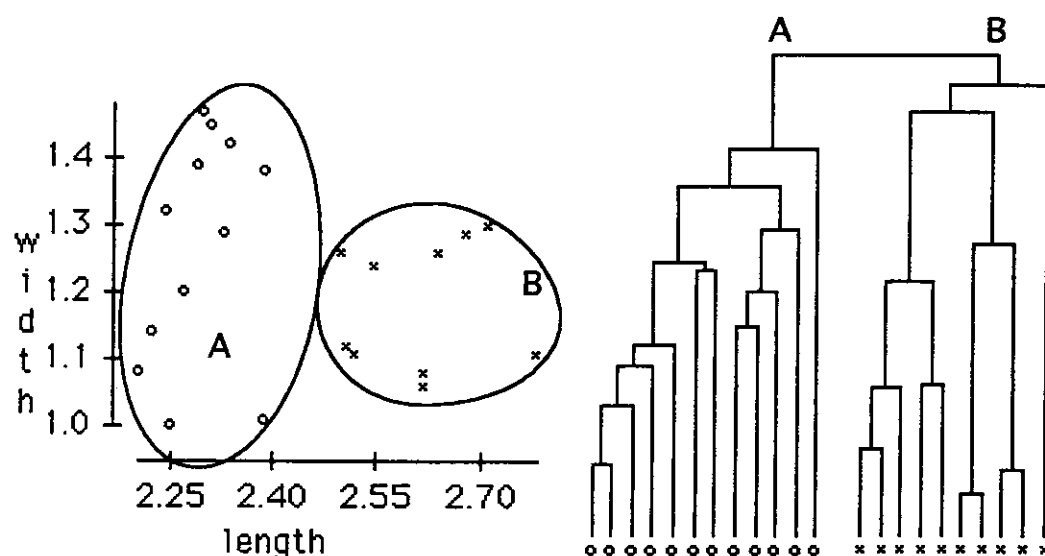


Fig. 2.42a-c: Perspective views of couch niches for the (a) *lectus summus*, (b) *lectus imus*, and (c) *lectus medius* in dining room (e) of the Casa di Paccius Alexander, IX.1.7 at Pompeii.

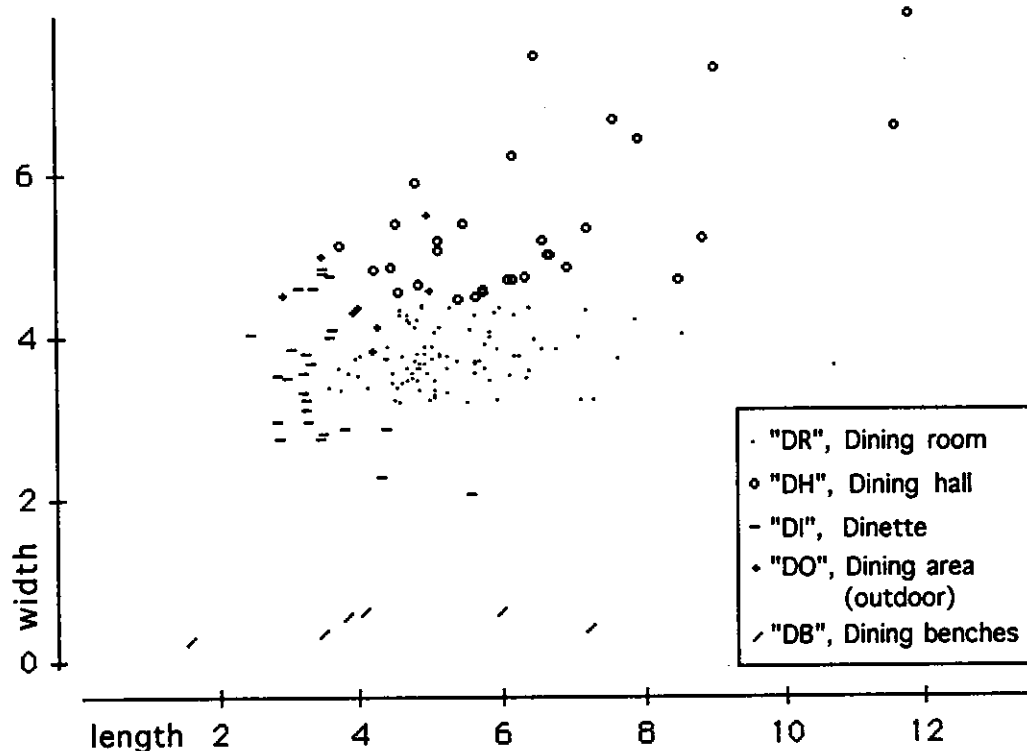


Fig. 2.44: Scatterplot of the dimensions for all types of dining areas, from the study sample: I.4, 6-10; VII.1, 14; IX.1-2.

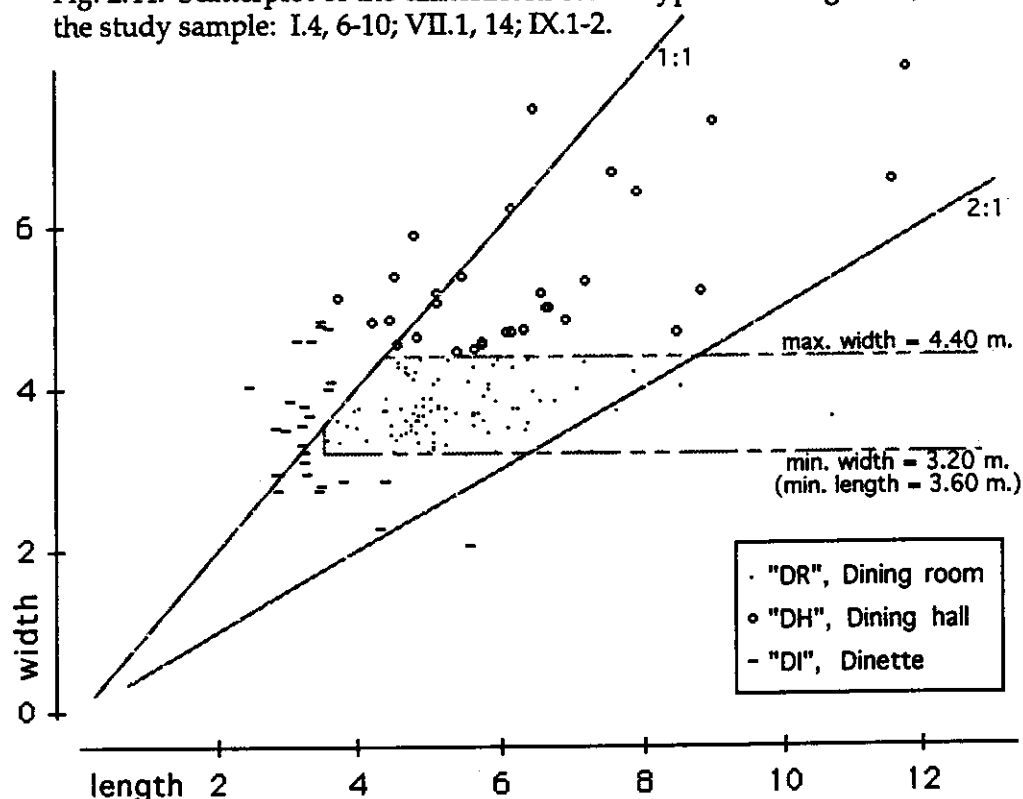


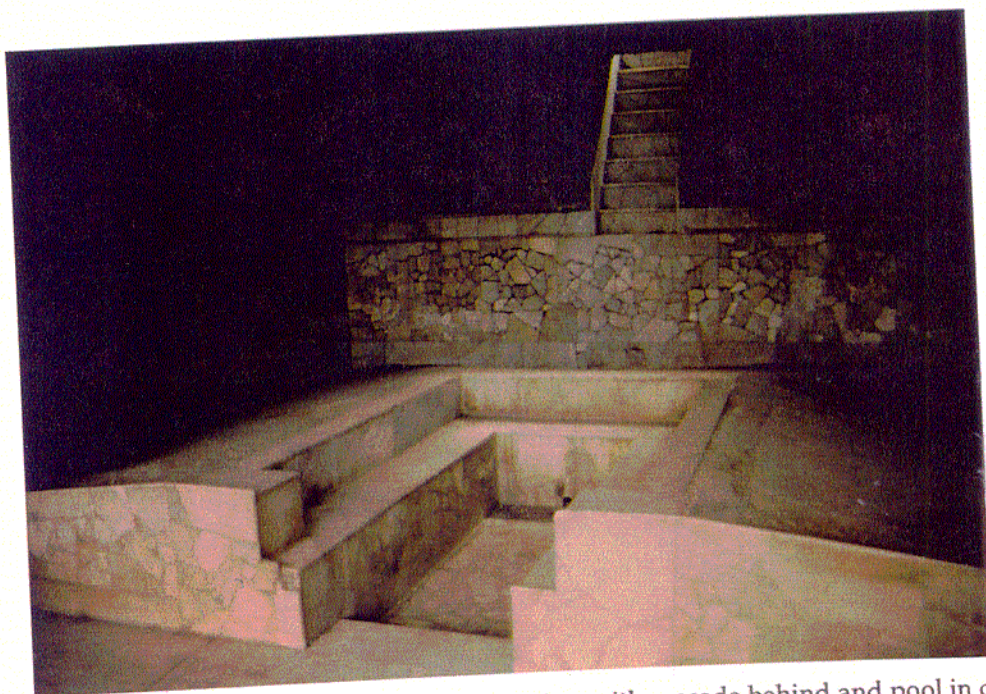
Fig. 2.45: Scatterplot of the dining area dimensions from the same study sample with the boundaries for types DR, DH and DI, and 1:1 and 2:1 proportions indicated.
